GCSE and A Level

We learned this week that the results of the government consultation will be shared at the end of February which means a frustrating wait to determine more concrete detail of GCSE and A Level gradings. Further details of our mock examination arrangements in March will be shared as soon as we are able to do so, but our intention is that assessments for Year 11 and 13 will commence in the third week after a return to school, currently week beginning 22 March.

Key Stage Three

Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 have had sessions about study skills and motivation, delivered by 'Maximise your Potential'. These have been well-received by the students and MYP commented favourably on the engagement, astuteness, and positivity of our students. Student feedback has been so positive we have asked the company to run a session for the parents of students in these year groups. This will take place at 7pm on 1 March 2021 and will be accessed via a weblink that will be sent out to parents at both Carre's Grammar School and Kesteven and Sleaford High School.

Parents' Evenings

Thanks to the many parents who have contacted the school because of attendance at one of our recent parents' evenings. There seems to be significant support from parents for us to continue with online parents' evenings even after the pandemic, and this is certainly something we are seriously considering.
