Mutual Respect

Core Concept:

- Treat others as you want to be treated
- Respect for each other
- Working together

Mutual Respect in MFL:

- In MFL, respect for those we are working with in the classroom is important
- Good collaborative working relationships in the classroom promote effective learning

The Rule of Law

Core Concept:

- Understanding rules and why they are important
- Following rules to develop order

The Rule of Law in MFL:

- In MFL, rules are in place for a number of reasons
- Some rules such as entering and exiting the classroom in an orderly manner are in place to maintain the safety of ourselves and others
- Other rules such as listening in silence when others are speaking and putting your hand up to ask or answer a question promote mutual respect and enable effective learning to take place

British Values in Modern Foreign Languages

Tolerance of Different Faiths and Beliefs

Core Concept:

- Learning about different faiths and cultures
- Listen to other viewpoints
- Learning about diversity

Tolerance of Different Faiths and Beliefs in MFL:

- In MFL, we have a responsibility as linguists not to exclude minority groups
- During group discussions, all students have the opportunity to express their own points of view
- Throughout the MFL courses, we learn about different faiths and cultures and these are explored in greater depth in the GCSE module on Customs and Festivals

Democracy

Core Concept:

- Making decisions together
- The right to an opinion/voice

Democracy in MFL:

- In MFL, collaborative decision making is important. This is facilitated throughout the courses by work in pairs or in larger groups
- In the MFL classroom, all students have the right to express their own opinion. This right is enabled by rules such as listening in silence and putting your hand up to ask or answer questions

Individual Liberty

Core Concept:

- Freedom of speech for all
- The right to make our own choices

Individual Liberty in MFL:

- The study of MFL gives students numerous opportunities to explore the concept of individual liberty
- Freedom of speech is promoted by allowing everyone to express their individual viewpoints
- Freedom of choice is explored in a variety of ways in MFL, from deciding which language to study at GCSE to discussing future potential career pathways
